RESOLUTION OF THE EXECUTIVE
COMMITTEE

Repudiation of Prior Endorsement; Reaffirmation of Compliance; Authorization to Petition the Judicial Committee

The Libertarian Party of New Hampshire

Adopted: June 4, 2026

WHEREAS, LPNH is the chartered state-level affiliate of the Libertarian Party in New Hampshire;

WHEREAS, prior to the election of the present Executive Committee, a prior Executive Committee of LPNH sharing no voting members with the current Executive Committee purported to endorse Donald Trump in the 2024 presidential election;

WHEREAS, Article 5, Section 4 of the Libertarian Party Bylaws prohibits affiliate endorsement of candidates of other parties, and the present Executive Committee does not ratify the November 4, 2024 act;

WHEREAS, the present Executive Committee was elected by the LPNH membership at its March 2026 annual conventions and wishes to reaffirm LPNH's institutional commitment to the Bylaws and Statement of Principles going forward;

WHEREAS, on May 25, 2026, the Libertarian National Committee purported to revoke LPNH's affiliate-party status; LPNH received the formal Notice of Revocation on June 4, 2026;

WHEREAS, the present Executive Committee wishes to reaffirm LPNH's institutional commitment to the Bylaws and Statement of Principles and to authorize challenge of the purported revocation through the appellate process the Bylaws provide;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Executive Committee of the Libertarian Party of New Hampshire as follows:

Repudiation

1. The Executive Committee does not ratify, and repudiates, the November 4, 2024 endorsement of Donald Trump. That act does not reflect the position of LPNH as the present institution speaks.

Reaffirmation of compliance going forward

2. The Executive Committee reaffirms LPNH's institutional commitment to Article 5, Section 4 of the Bylaws and to the Statement of Principles of the Libertarian Party.
3. Going forward, no act of LPNH as an institution — and no act of any officer or agent of LPNH undertaken in an official capacity on its behalf — shall constitute an endorsement of any candidate of any other party for public office in any partisan election.
4. The Executive Committee shall monitor LPNH's institutional conduct for compliance with these provisions and shall take prompt corrective action with respect to any conduct inconsistent with them.

Authorization to petition the Judicial Committee

5. The Executive Committee **authorizes the Chair, Jeremy Kauffman**, in his representative capacity on behalf of LPNH, to prepare, sign, and file a petition with the Judicial Committee under Article 5, Section 6 and Article 8, Section 2(a) of the Bylaws, seeking reversal of the purported revocation and interim relief preserving the status quo.
6. The Chair is further authorized to **engage counsel** and to take such further actions as he deems appropriate to protect LPNH's rights and interests consistent with this Resolution.
7. The Secretary shall certify this Resolution and transmit it as the Chair directs.

Scope

- Nothing in this Resolution waives any defense, claim, or argument available to LPNH in any subsequent proceeding, including LPNH's contentions that the Libertarian National Committee failed to specify cause, failed to provide notice and opportunity to be heard, proceeded contrary to the deliberative judgment of the 2026 Regular Convention, escalated inconsistently with its September 2025 censure disposition, and acted with punitive rather than corrective intent.
